PIANGO Strengthens Relationship with Members

The Pacific Islands Association of Non Government Organisations (PIANGO) in conjunction with Samoa Umbrella for Non Governmental Organisation (SUNGO), hosted a meeting on Wednesday 30th of April 2014, focusing on 'Consolidation through Strengthening Relationships between PIANGO and local level communities.

The meeting brought together Non Governmental Organisations (NGOs) and Community Based Organisations (CBOs) enabling these groups to contribute to discussions on development effectiveness for the region, to solicit their views, priorities, framework for implementation, areas of collaboration and identify requirements for strategic management. Feedback also included areas to strengthen the development practices of its Regional Organisation.

The aim of this consultation was to help local communities and NGOs in Samoa understand the role and work PIANGO provides for its members specifically in the Pacific. The consultation was also to inform NGOs and CBO leaders on the Global Civil Society Organisation (CSO) Campaign on 'Beyond 2015'. The Beyond 2015 is a Global CSO campaign, is pushing for a strong and legitimate successor framework to the Millennium Development Goal (MDG). PIANGO is coordinating this campaign in the Pacific, Samoa is one of the priority country with SUNGO leading the project.

This consultative process will ensure our Pacific voices are heard. The Pacific region will be part of a global community focusing on the same agenda and implementation which best suits the needs of our Pacific people.

To become a member your organization must:

- 1. consist of committee or a board
- 2. Submit a list of 15+ members,
- 3. Specify whether it is an Non Gov ernmental Organization (NGO- submit its constitution) or Community Bæsed Organization (CBO)

 State clearly what the organization does and what it offers and how the general public will benefit from its work.

Application process:

- 1. Fill in application form from SUNGO Office and return it to SUNGO,
- 2. Application to be approved from SUNGO Board,
- 3. If the Board approves the application, y ou will received a letter of approval,
- 4. Your organization will then to pay \$100 for NGOs and \$50 for CBOs for annual membership fee,
- 5. Your organization will received all the information from SUNGO and an explanation on how your organization will benef it from SUNGO.

SUNGO Delivers Project Design Management Training (PDM)

A pplications for CSSP Funding in the Open Category closed in mid February, to help community groups make well written and relevant applications to CSSP. SUNGO provided three Project Design and Management (PDM) workshops before application close. The Aim of this course is to build skill and capacity of CSOs applying to CSSP to design, plan projects, write proposals for a complete and well put together CSSP Form that will address the concerns of their target beneficiaries and communities.



Three workshops were provided - two in Sav aii and one in Upolu. Ov erall 71 participants attended the workshops representing 27 organisations. While this was fewer than expected some present represents two or more organisations. Almost equal numbers of women and men attended and 85% of the participants successfully completed the course. Each day, the participants sit a pre and post test to assess how well they have learnt. Some very positive feedback was received by SUNGO through the course evaluation conducted at end of each course.

NGO ASSESSMENT UPDATE

Based on recommendations from CSSP, a second round of assessments was initiated in October 2013. The NGOs selected were those organisations making application for funding. These NGOs are:

- 1. Samoa National Youth Council
- 2. Samoa Returnees Charitable Trust
- 3. Samoa Farmers Association
- 4. Samoa Hotels Association

Planning the timing of these assessments was based on completing the assessments prior to the Category 3 applications being considered by the Steering Committee in late Dec. Initial meetings were held with the managers of these NGOs and the separate assessment sessions held with the staff and management of most of this group.

With staff changes at some of these NGOs there were some delays in completing these assessments. All four NGOs completed the initial first step of the process however only two continued on with the process

Difficulties were experienced with Samoa Farmers Association after their volunteers who expressed interest in the NGO Assessment finished their project and moved back home to NZ. SHA also were not able to continue on with the assessment due to unforeseen circumstances.

Samoa National Youth Council's assessment finished in the timeframe scheduled however Samoa Returnees Charitable Trust has complications with setting up meetings with their Board of Trustees. Fortunately, the process assessment was completed and the official report was sent to CSSP in February.

SUNGO Civil Society Forum for SIDs Conference Preparation.

SUNGO hosted its first 2014 Civil Society Forum on 23rd April 2014. The main purpose of this Forum was to prepare for the SIDs Conference to be held later this year in August and September.

The Forum started with a Keynotef rom the Honourable Prime Minister Tuilaepa Fatialof a Lupesoliai Sailele Malielegaoi. He congratulated SUNGO on the work accomplished last y ear and highlighted on the effects of Climate Change. "Samoa is in the process of making changes to help prevent and reduce effects to Climate Change, and NGOs have a huge role to play in all these plans. My advice is to strengthen y our arguments and to not be afraid to stand your ground as the results from SIDs conference will determine the amendments of some policies worldwide".



The event continued with a number of presentations from various Organisations and Government Ministries; MNRE ACEO Filomena Nelson on Climate Change and Disaster Risk Management, MNRE ACEO Salā Sagato & Rev Reupena Leau of Piu Falealili on Sustainable Renewable Energy, GOSHEN Trust Chairperson Alalatoa Breda Faitua on Social Development, Health, NCD, Youth and Women, ACEO MNRE Juney Ward on Ocean Seas and Biodiversity & Marine Land Base, Red Cross Secretary General Namulauulu Tautala Mauala on Food Security, concluded with a brief summarisation from the SUNGO SIDs Coordinator Lemalu Nele Leilua with her presentation.

SIDS Update

There are four pre-conference forums already approved prior to the main SIDS conference from September 1-4th 2014.

C PDC in partnership with the Commonwealth Foundation will be hosting a Civil Society Regional Forum in June this year in Apia. The theme of the Conference is "Commonwealth SIDS CSOS – Advancing our partnerships for Sustainable Development".

SUNGO has been requested by the CPDC to act as a local partner in this Forum, to provide input into the Conference design specifically selection of Pacific and local Representatives and to assist with the agenda. Provision of advice regarding the logistical arrangement and to provide advice on specific dynamics relating to CSO involvement in the upcoming Samoa meeting, targets within the region for influencing and other possible collaborations that could assist in building linkages around the meeting and post Samoa.

The Regional CSO Forum in June will be held at the Moanalisa Hotel Vaitele, which will include 14 regional participants and 8 local representatives.

GOSHEN TRUST extended its services on

16th April 2014 by the launching for its 'Step-Down Rehabilitation Unit' based at Moamoa. The project was funded by European Union via Civil Society Support Programme (CSSP). Through this project, GOSHEN aims to work together with Ministry of Health through the Mental Health Unit to ensure health care rehabilitation services are scaled up within the county for mental disorders.
