Strengthening Grassroots Development: Samoa and Japan Celebrate Signing Ceremony for SUNGO Training Centre



Tuesday, 7th January 2025, SNPF Plaza, Apia. - In a landmark moment for community development in Samoa, the Government of Japan and the Samoa Umbrella for Non-Governmental Organizations (SUNGO) officially signed an agreement to launch the construction of a new training centre under Japan's Grant Assistance for Grass-Roots Human Security Projects (GGP).

The signing ceremony, held on January 7, 2025, was attended by H.E. Mr. SUZUKI Ryotaro, Ambassador Extraordinary and Plenipotentiary of Japan to Samoa, and Afioga Fuimaono Vaitolo Ofoia, CEO of SUNGO. The agreement formalizes Japan's commitment

to provide a grant of *USD* 137,222 (approximately SAT 367,755) to fund the construction of a purpose-built training facility in Vaitele-Tai village.

This infrastructure is designed to serve as a vital hub for capacity building, empowering over 230 NGOs and community stakeholders across Samoa. The centre is expected to host approximately 50 training sessions annually, each accommodating 30 to 60 participants. By equipping participants with practical skills and knowledge, the centre aims to strengthen the resilience


Over three dynamic days, council members immersed themselves in practical workshops covering transparency, accountability, leadership, and ethical decision-making. The sessions, facil-
